



Is Cynthia Telles **QUALIFIED** to serve on the Los Angeles Airport Commission?

Cynthia Telles has a track record of ignoring her constituents.

In addition to serving on the Airport Commission, Dr. Telles is a member of Kaiser Permanente's Board of Directors. Dr. Telles — a psychologist — refuses to meet with Kaiser's psychologists and therapists about Kaiser's severe patient care violations that have resulted in a multi-million dollar fine, class-action lawsuits, and allegations of tragic suicides.

KAISER'S MENTAL HEALTH CRISIS

- In 2013, the Department of Managed Health Care fined Kaiser \$4 million for illegally delaying patients' access to mental health services. The fine is the second largest in the agency's history.
- Kaiser has systematically understaffed its mental health services, forcing patients to wait weeks — and sometimes months — to receive care, often with tragic results.

KAISER'S SOARING PROFITS

- Kaiser — a “nonprofit” — is raking in record profits: \$12.5 billion since 2009, and \$1.1 billion in the first quarter of 2014.
- In 2012, Kaiser paid its CEO \$11 million and provided him with a chauffeur-driven car and other perks.
- Dr. Telles receives \$226,717 a year to attend just six meetings of Kaiser's Board of Directors.
