

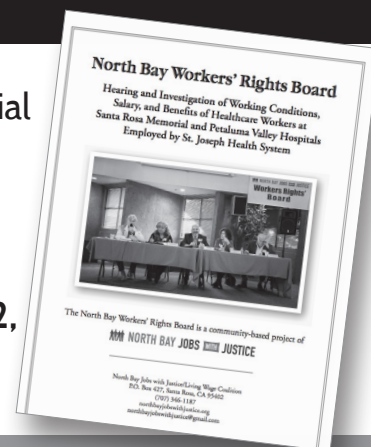
# COMMUNITY ALERT

## Understaffing at Santa Rosa Memorial Hospital has contributed to patient falls and risk of infection, bedsores, and errors in patient care

According to the California Department of Public Health

The North Bay Workers' Rights Board found that Santa Rosa Memorial Hospital is out of compliance with state regulations that require hospitals to implement an acuity-based system that provides appropriate staffing based on the needs of each patient.

As a result of St. Joseph's failure to comply with California's Title 22, caregivers are struggling to meet the needs of their patients.



### THE NORTH BAY WORKERS' RIGHTS BOARD STRONGLY RECOMMENDS:

St. Joseph should increase Memorial's staffing to comply with Title 22 and improve patient safety.

Supervisors should meet regularly with staff to fully address the needs of patients and caregivers.

Wages should be increased to prevent worker turnover and retain experienced caregivers.
