CAREGIVERS LOCKED OUT, PATIENTS AT RISK



We are Providence Tarzana Medical Center caregivers who are being locked out of our jobs until Tuesday because we held a one-day strike to improve the hospital.

This lockout is an extreme act of retaliation that is leaving patients in the care of unfamiliar, untested temporary workers.

We held our first ever Unfair Labor Practice Strike Thursday because management has given us no hope for a deal that respects our dignity and improves patient care.

Putting profits ahead of patient care, Providence Tarzana this year began sending too many of us home in the middle of our shifts to boost its bottom line.

Other times, we've been told not to come into work at all, leaving nursing assistants to sometimes have to care for up to 30 patients at once.

Providence Tarzana's penny-pinching policy is bad for patients — and caregivers. And the four-day lockout shows that the hospital has no intention of doing right by its workers or patients. Please send a message to Providence Tarzana to honor its principals.
