WEALTHY USC HOLDS WAGES DOWN, KEEPS **WORKERS IN POVERTY**

More than 1,100 USC hospital workers are picketing to demand fair wage increases for ourselves and a fair deal for more than 80 cafeteria workers whose jobs have been outsourced to Sodexo, a conglomerate that pays pennies above minimum wage.

USC has a \$5.1 billion endowment and its hospitals made \$30 million in 2016. But they refuse to offer their hospital workers decent wage increases, and their cafeteria workers make so little that they qualify for taxpayerfunded programs like food stamps and Medi-Cal.

Last year, facing public pressure, the university cancelled its contract with Sodexo for 50 housekeeping jobs at Norris Comprehensive Cancer Center and made those workers direct Keck USC employees full members of the "Trojan Family," with better wages, retirement and health benefits, and tuition assistance for their children.
