DO YOU CONTINUE TO ACCRUE VACATION TIME WHILE BEING FLEXED? YES!

We recently learned that some union members may not be aware that they can still accrue vaction time while being flexed. This is a long-standing practice and is stated in the employer's policy:

"When business needs dictate, non-exempt employees may be asked to "flex" — to take time off based on business needs. Non-



exempt employees may elect to take flex time as paid vacation time or unpaid time. If an employee is flexed, he/she will continue to accrue vacation for the hours flexed."

To continue accruing vacation time while you are being flexed, complete the Managers Edit Form as follows:

- For the question **Flexed Voluntary** check "N."
- Write a brief description under **Explanation** for example, "Accrue vacation time for hours flexed."
- Make a copy for your records and submit original to your supervisor.
- On all other questions, just follow the directions.

The parties agreed to implementat a new holiday sign up process that complies with the union contract. "It is our job as members and stewards to make sure our contract is implemented correctly," said Gibbs.



As a result of this meeting, representatives from HR will be attending our future steward council meetings to clarify any issues related to the proper implementation of our union contract.

NUHW WINS FOUR ORGANIZING ELECTIONS

In four separate elections, more than 120 healthcare workers voted to join NUHW.

The elections expand our growing presence at Keck Medicine of the University of Southern California and Marin General Hospital, where our members have already won strong contracts for our members.



At USC, our newest members include technicians at a sleep disorder center, licensed vocational nurses, medical assistants and clerical workers at an internal medicine clinic and call center workers.

At Marin General, 28 pharmacy and medical technicians voted to form a union with us. They voted to join NUHW, at the same our members at the hospital were putting the final touches on a new contract that will boost average wages by more than 30 percent over the next five years.
