BANKRUPTCY AND BARGAINING UPDATE

On April 17, the U.S. Bankruptcy Court approved the KPC Group's bid to purchase Verity's four remaining hospitals including Seton Medical Center and Seton Coastside. The court's approval sets in motion a transition to new ownership over several months.

During this phase of the process, California Attorney General Xavier Becerra will review KPC's proposal to ensure that Seton and Coastside continue as acute care hospitals, offering the community high quality patient care in seismically safe facilities. Notably, KPC has asked the court to phase out oncology services.

Under the terms of the bankruptcy, Verity is permitted to bargain over the current contract. KPC will work through Verity to provide NUHW their proposal on our current contract. Bankruptcy law requires NUHW to negotiate in good faith over the terms of their proposal. Since February, our members have been preparing, electing a good part of their bargaining team.

The Bargaining Committee will have its first planning meeting on Thursday, June 27, at 4 P.M. at Seton.

Bargaining is scheduled to start on Monday and Tuesday, July 8 and 9.
