HAVE YOU WORKED MORE THAN SEVEN CONSECUTIVE DAYS?

Don't let management cheat you out of your overtime

Our contract is crystal clear — when we must work more than seven consecutive days without a day off, the hospital must pay us time-and-a-half for each day worked after the seventh day — until we finally get a day off.

However, a couple EVS workers recently reported that they didn't receive time-and-half for their shifts after working seven consecutive days. A few of them had worked more than 20 consecutive days off without receiving consecutive overtime.

We've filed a class-action grievance on behalf of the entire department to ensure this problem is corrected and everybody is made whole.



Management originally agreed to audit its records but has since backed out of that commitment. We urge everyone to check your Kronos records for times where you've worked more than 7 days in a row, and compare those dates with your paystubs to be sure that you received OT for those days. If you see any discrepancies — or if you have any reason to believe you have not been fully paid for your work — please contact your steward or your NUHW organizer.
