PTO policy gives us freedom of choice

During the later part of 2022, all of a sudden in several departments, management began changing the policy on PTO usage by requiring staff to use PTO for any and all leaves (sick, vacation, random days off). This change was not consistent with the long established past practice.

We filed class action grievances for all NUHW members and when management refused to settle the issue, we also filed charges against the hospital at the National Labor Relations Board.

During RN/PRO contract negotiations, we reached agreement with management and the contract provides that it is up to the RNs/ Pros if they wish to utilize PTO or not for vacation, sick.



holidays, random days off.

Following the RN/PRO settlement, the union and management mutually agreed to settle the grievance and the NLRB charge and implement the same policy hospital wide. Now all NUHW members have the choice of when to use PTO.

The one exception is that PTO must be used for kincare. Kincare is protected leave and under California law you may utilize up to 50 percent of your accrual; therefore that must be tracked and accounted for.

NUHW MEMBERS MEET WITH CONGRESSMAN LOU CORREA



NUHW Shop Stewards Mailinh Nguyen, Float Pool CNA; Julie Hayward, RN OB; and Zach Hodgens, Radiology at West Anaheim Medical Center met with Congressman Lou Correa at his office in Santa Ana at his request to hear about the difficulties healthcare workers experience every day at their facilities. They shared their testimony regarding safe staffing issues, the lapse of state-funded COVID leave and worsening health in the patient population. The Congressman committed to meeting with our members again and supporting us in our fight to improve the healthcare system across Orange County and the country.



Members protest schedule cuts in Dietary Department

When the hospital began making cuts to part-time workers' schedules in the Dietary department, which would mean reductions of up to 50 percent in hours for some employees, NUHW shop stewards quickly organized a petition. Within one week, a majority of their coworkers signed. On February 16, Dietary workers organized a delegation and submitted a petition to management demanding they stop understaffing their department and expecting the remaining staff to do the same amount of work with less people. Dietary and EVS are subcontracted out to Morrison Healthcare and Crothall Healthcare, collectively known as Compass.


RNs FILE NOTICE OF 92 STAFFING VIOLATIONS!

RNs continue to hold Tenet accountable for safe care. In mid February, another 92 violations were filed with the California State Department of Health for failure to abide by ratios and lack of charge nurses available. All reported violations occurred in the last four months.



It is vital that all Fountain Valley Registered Nurses report when Tenet BREAKS THE LAW by not respecting patient ratios and/or by assigning charge nurses patients!

We will be contacting management to begin the monthly meetings as required in our contracts.
