UNSAFE WORKING CONDITIONS!

The Queen has stopped following basic COVID-19 infection control practices, which has resulted in dozens of staff throughout our hospital being exposed to COVID-19.

Cases are still rising in Napa County and across California. Why is the Queen disregarding basic safety standards now, of all times?

We are demanding the Queen immediately implement the following practices to protect our patients, our community, and our fellow healthcare workers:

- Test every patient for COVID-19 infection upon admission to the hospital.
- Assume all patients are potentially infected with COVID-19 and implement infection control accordingly until a negative COVID-19 test result is received.
- Provide testing and paid precautionary leave to all employees who are exposed to COVID-19 at work.
- Require all patients who are medically able to wear a surgical mask any time they are in close contact or the same room as a healthcare worker or any other individual.
- Place all PUIs and confirmed COVID-19 patients in an airborne infection isolation room (AIIR) and provide staff caring for these patients with PPE for droplet and airborne precautions including a NIOSH-approved N95 respirator or higher per Cal/OSHA's ATD Standard.
- Perform all aerosol-generating procedures on PUIs and confirmed COVID-19 patients in an AIIR and provide staff performing these aerosol-generating procedures with a PAPR per Cal/OSHA's ATD Standard.

These are common sense best practices that keep us, our patients, and our community safe.
