WE'RE STRIKING FOR OUR SONOMA COUNTY COMMUNITY



For too long, Santa Rosa Memorial Hospital has been **slashing jobs**,

cutting corners on Personal Protective Equipment, and stockpiling cash for its out-of-state corporate owner, Providence St. Joseph Health.

Over the past three years, we have kept our hospital open and served patients through the North Bay Fire, the Kincade Fire, and a pandemic. Meanwhile Santa Rosa Memorial has netted a **\$201 million** operating profit.

But instead of investing that money to improve healthcare in Sonoma County, Santa Rosa Memorial and Providence St. Joseph are lavishing executives with six-figure bonuses, while demanding that caregivers accept **insufficient PPE**, **unsafe staffing levels**, **cuts to paid-time-off** including sick leave, and **huge increases to health care costs**, including **more than doubling health care premiums**.

Our hospital has left us with no choice. We're going on strike to make Santa Rosa Memorial put its patients and caregivers first.
