After nearly a year of bargaining with a hospital that reported a massive \$72,846,828 operating profit in 2019, Providence is still trying to force us to accept unfair takeaways.

We're holding an INFORMATIONAL PICKET to show that we deserve fair wages, affordable healthcare, and enough PTO to take care of ourselves and our families.

This is an informational picket, not a strike: Join us outside in front of the hospital during lunches, breaks, before and after shifts or during your time off. Masks, gloves and hand sanitizer will be available.

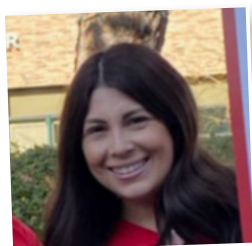
