

3-DAY STRIKE AUTHORIZATION VOTE

Sutter doesn't think we're capable of holding another strike, and they're testing our resolve at the bargaining table. Management has made a tiny bit of movement in negotiations, agreeing to our terms on accommodations for breast-feeding moms, but **they're continuing to disrespect us by failing to provide counter-proposals on critical issues, including wages, retirement benefits, health benefits and PTO.**

The only way to win a good contract is to make Sutter understand that we'll never stop fighting until we have a fair deal. The more people who vote to authorize the 3-day strike, the stronger the message we'll send to Sutter.

WHEN WILL WE GO ON STRIKE?

We don't know yet. That depends on how bargaining goes with the federal mediator. The authorization vote gives our Bargaining Committee the authority to call a 3-day strike, if Sutter doesn't make sufficient movement at the table. We will keep everyone posted as soon as we know.
