Yesterday, as NUHW President Emeritus Sal Rosselli joined us in bargaining, he witnessed the unacceptable wage proposal from management: 67% of us would face a wage freeze with a lump sum payment.

Let's be clear: Management says they can't afford to pay Keck wages, but somehow, they always find money to invest in new equipment and expand other services, like the Emergency Department, which was discussed in the State of the Hospital last week. They think they can spend money on everything but us—the heart and soul of Verdugo Hills Hospital and Keck Medicine of USC.

Let's face it: They want to pay us less, but we're the reason this place functions. And let's not forget, the reason so many of us are leaving for higher pay elsewhere. It's because we've been undervalued for too long. If USC truly wants to provide world-class care, they need to invest in world-class caregivers.

Our bargaining committee meets this week to plan our next steps. We are not backing down and will keep fighting for what we've earned.

While we continue fighting for fair wages, we're also winning crucial battles. We've already secured a victory on the Hours of Work proposal. This isn't just about clocks, it's about respecting our time. We've set clear guidelines for our workday, mandated breaks, and enforced state laws on overtime pay. We've fought to make sure schedules are posted in advance, not at the last minute, giving us the clarity we deserve. And when it comes to calloffs, registry and travelers will be the first to go — not us.

We've taken a stand. Now it's time for management to take us seriously.
